THE FINE PRINT

• PAYMENT: You will be contacted via email or phone about your application. Once your application is accepted, a deposit of \$300 will be due within two weeks to hold your spot. Full payment of \$1,500 (\$1,200 if already deposited) must be received no later than 30 days prior to the camp start date. Please make out your payment by check to: Emory & Henry College Collegiate Bound Summer Riding Camp. We gladly accept personal checks.

Do you have any special dietary needs?

- REFUND POLICY: Cancellations prior to the due date of full payment (30 days prior to camp start date) will forfeit the deposit. Cancellations after the full payment is received will not be refunded unless your spot may be filled from a waiting list. If your spot is filled from a waiting list, then all but the deposit will be refunded. We recommend you purchase cancellation insurance for your protection. If a participant withdraws voluntarily or is sent home as a consequence of unacceptable behavior (see below), no refund of any type will be granted. It is the parents' responsibility to cover any additional travel expenses.
- RULES: E&H Collegiate Bound Summer Riding Program maintains very high standards because we act as temporary guardians for your child. We cannot and will not tolerate use of illegal drugs, alcohol, or tobacco products during any adventure. Illegal acts, stealing or any behavior that is detrimental to the welfare, safety, or success of the group are not acceptable. Behavior which negatively affects other students' rights to enjoy the camp or any type of sexual harassment will not be tolerated. Dorm rooms are never co-ed. In the unfortunate instance that a rule violation should occur, immediate dismissal will most likely result. The offending participant will be sent home immediately at his/ her parents' expense and no refund of any type will be granted. Each student agrees that they will abide by E&H Collegiate Bound Summer Riding Camp policies and rules for the duration of the camp.
- MEDICAL FORM/LIABILITY RELEASE: A completed and signed Medical Form and a signed Release/Assumption of Risk must be submitted for review after official acceptance. Parents are required to sign the Release/Assumption of Risk document from E&H Collegiate Bound Summer Riding Camp.
- MEDICAL TREATMENT: Trained Instructors have the right to administer first aid to participants, to engage the services of a physician or dentist, or to hospitalize a participant if deemed necessary. Costs will be the responsibility of parents and/ or their insurance company. Our areas of expertise do not extend to handling behavioral, psychological, motivational or rehabilitation issues.

ABOUT THE CAMP:

Intermont Equestrian at Emory & Henry College, a premier College Equine Program is proud to offer three collegiate riding camps catering to riders ages 14-18. Emphasis in twice daily mounted sessions will be placed on correct schooling and showing techniques for riders in Hunter Seat, Dressage and Show Jumping.

Participants in the camps will stay overnight in the <u>dorms on the beautiful Emory & Henry Campus</u> and <u>ride at the Intermont Equestrian Center</u>, home of the college's 22-time national championship winning equestrian teams. The camps are designed for serious riders who wish to compete in collegiate riding, are part of an <u>Interscholastic Equestrian Association (IEA)</u> team or just want to improve their riding skills. Riders applying for the camps should have an intermediate or better level of riding proficiency and be comfortable jumping a course of jumps at 2'6" and/or schooling first level dressage.

Equestrian at Emory & Henry College is based on traditional horsemanship, and emphasis on the mechanisms of the horse, and the workings of the rider position. Riders will get a taste of the curriculum through evening educational sessions presented by the Equine Studies faculty on topics like sport horse conformation, equine nutrition, equine health management, stable management and show ring braiding.

In addition participants will have some non-horse related activities that will allow them to <u>enjoy the offerings of the Emory & Henry campus</u> and the surrounding area—nestled in the heart of the Appalachian Mountains.

ABOUT THE INSTRUCTORS:

Lisa Moosmueller-Terry, clinical associate professor of equine studies, di rector of the Equestrian Center and IDA coach, led the Intermont IDA teams to national championships in 2006, 2007, 2010, 2014, 2016 and 2018 and a reserve national championship in 2009 before coming to Emory & Henry. She worked with the teams that earned 4 national championships in IHSA in 2004, 2005, 2007 and 2019 as well as the ANRC team that was champion in 2004 and reserve champion in 2014. A graduate of Virginia Intermont College with a B.A. in equine studies, she worked as an Olympic show jumping groom and as a manager and trainer at an FEI level dressage barn. Inducted into the IDA Hall of Fame and named Coach of the Year, she was among the first members of the IDA's Board of Directors, where she serves as vice president and regional representative. Additionally, she is a Level III certified American Riding Instructor in hunt seat and dressage and is certified at Level I with EAGALA.

Heather Richardson, clinical associate professor of equine studies and IHSA/ANRC coach, has a degree in equine studies from Virginia Intermont College. She has competed extensively in both the hunter and jumper rings and concluded her junior career by competing in the 1996 Prix des States for Zone 7. Prior to earning her degree, she rode and trained under Lyn Owens and Jimmy Cantwell. Following graduation, she worked for Kat Mulkey in Atlanta, where she was responsible for teaching and taking clients to horse shows as well as breaking and training show hunters. While in Atlanta, she rode with Anne Kenan of Hunter Hill Farm. In 2014, she coached the ANRC National Reserve Champion team.

Jessica Denniston, clinical assistant professor of equine studies is a graduate of Virginia Intermont College (VIC), holds a bachelors in equine studies and is pursuing a masters of education in equestrian education. While at VIC she minored in equine assisted growth and learning and is now an EAGALA certified equine specialist. Denniston joins the Intermont Equestrian faculty after coaching collegiately for the past six years in Georgia. Prior to her time in Georgia, she worked as an assistant trainer to a USDF bronze medalist preparing young horses for registry inspections, helping start young horses and taking young horses on first outings to shows and clinics. She then went on to teach a variety of levels of riders in the hunter, equitation and dressage arenas in a program outside of the D.C. area.
